That said, I am writing from Lahore in Pakistan where I am visiting the Children's Hospital and University of Child Health Sciences. A very warm 24°C in their spring heading for 40°C+ in the summer! This is reputedly the second biggest Children's Hospital in the world and probably the largest in patient numbers with 4-6000 kids arriving every day at OPD and 1500 into emergency. Of the latter the biggest issues are birth asphyxia, CNS infections, prematurity and seizures. A huge number of hydrocephalus and spina bifida patients go to neurosurgery (90+/day). This gives a real life perspective on the research we all do towards potential preventatives and better treatments.

The really good to share with you all is that our annual meeting is now up and ready for abstract submissions. We have a stellar cast of keynote speakers in a number of themes across 3 days. Please do look at the details on the website and submit your abstracts to the topic sessions or general session. Oral and poster presentations accepted with our usual prizes on offer.
