The conference features interactive and collaborative opportunities, including:

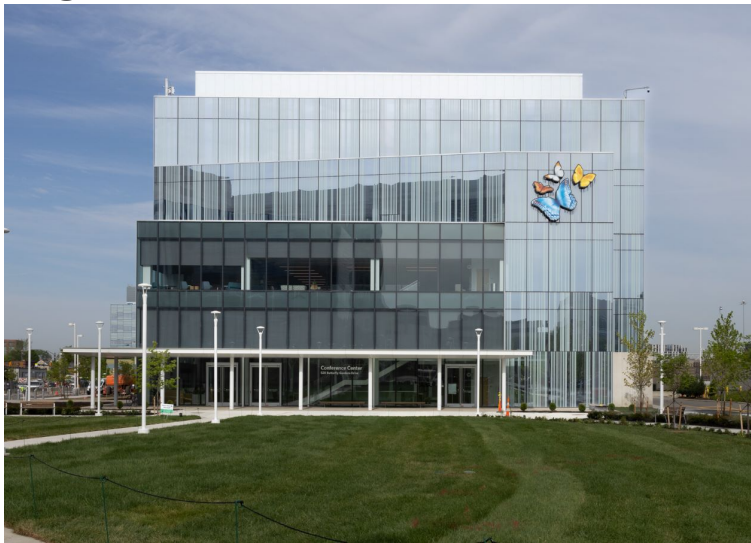
- **Engineering in Hydrocephalus (Fireside Chat):** Dive into technological advancements and their clinical applications.

Travelling to Columbus

By Air

John Glenn Columbus International Airport (CMH):

- Columbus is served by John Glenn Columbus International Airport (CMH), located approximately 6 miles (15 minutes by car) from downtown Columbus.
- CMH offers direct flights from major U.S. cities and international hubs, including connections via Chicago, Atlanta, New York, Washington D.C., Toronto, and more.
- Airlines operating at CMH include Delta, United, American Airlines, Southwest, Air Canada, and others.

Travel from CMH to Downtown Columbus:

- **Taxi/Ride-Sharing:** Taxis and ride-sharing services such as Uber and Lyft are readily available and cost approximately \$20–\$30 to downtown.
- **Rental Cars:** Multiple rental car agencies are located on-site at CMH for those who prefer to drive.
- **Shuttle Services:** Some hotels, including the Hilton Downtown Columbus, offer airport shuttle services. Check with your hotel for availability.

By Train

While Columbus does not have direct Amtrak service, nearby cities such as Cincinnati, Cleveland, and Pittsburgh offer train connections. From these cities, Columbus is accessible by bus or car.

By Bus

Greyhound and Megabus:

- Greyhound and Megabus provide intercity bus service to Columbus from major cities across the United States. The main bus station is located in downtown Columbus, within walking distance or a short ride to the Hilton Downtown Columbus and conference venues.

By Car

Columbus is centrally located in the Midwest and easily accessible by car from many nearby cities:

- Cincinnati: ~2 hours
- Cleveland: ~2.5 hours
- Pittsburgh: ~3 hours
- Indianapolis: ~3 hours
- Chicago: ~6 hours

Parking is available at the Hilton Downtown Columbus, Nationwide Children's Hospital, and The Ohio State University.

Getting Around Columbus

Public Transportation:

- Central Ohio Transit Authority (COTA): Offers bus services throughout Columbus, including routes to downtown and major attractions.
- CBUS Downtown Circulator: A free bus service connecting downtown Columbus, the Short North Arts District, and the Brewery District.

Taxis and Ride-Sharing:

- Uber and Lyft are widely available and convenient for travel around the city.

Bike Rentals:

- CoGo Bike Share offers a network of rental bikes, perfect for short trips around the city.

 - The official currency is the U.S. Dollar (USD). Currency exchange services are available at the airport, major banks, and currency exchange offices.
3. Time Zone:
 - Columbus operates on Eastern Standard Time (EST), UTC-5.
4. Weather:
 - In August, Columbus experiences warm summer weather with average temperatures ranging from 65°F (18°C) to 85°F (29°C). We recommend packing lightweight, comfortable clothing for the season.

- The abstract submission deadline is **March 31st 2025, at 11:59 PM (EST).**

Notification of Acceptance and Publication

- Abstracts will be reviewed by the SRHSB Expert Review Panel, and notifications of acceptance will be issued on a rolling basis.
- Abstracts are welcome for Oral Platform Presentations and Poster Presentations. Posters can be presented either as digital posters or traditional printed posters,

depending on the presenter's preference. Please indicate your preference on submission.

- It is intended that accepted abstracts will be published in a peer-reviewed journal.

We encourage you to submit your Abstract early to take advantage of the rolling review process, so that you'll receive early confirmation of acceptance and can make conference plans. We would be pleased to receive abstracts for any oral and/or poster presentations on themes related to hydrocephalus, spina bifida, CSF and NTDs, including therapeutic approaches and mechanistic insights.
